Signing Day, October 7, 1993

Twenty-five years ago, pen was put to paper, and the idea of creating a "fixed link" between Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick was born. Four years later and the Confederation Bridge was a reality.




After official signing of hundreds of documents in Toronto on October 7, 1993, the next day, Paul Giannelia of Strait Crossing (left), Bernard Valcourt, Federal Human Resources Minister (centre), and Peter McCreath, Federal Veterans Affairs Minister (right) gathered in Charlottetown to sign the final papers to build a bridge that would cross the Northumberland Strait.

On November 1st, 1993 the first shovel broke ground on what would be the fabrication yard for bridge components on the PEI side. An event of such magnitude was a great milestone, not only for the driving forces behind this venture, but for the people of Prince Edward Island alike. Completion of the Confederation Bridge would forever change the way travelling to and from the mainland would occur.



Before and After: Photos of the PEI Staging Facility in Borden - Carleton showing dramatic changes between June and November of 1994.


Construction...



One by one, main girders were placed, all pieces of the puzzle which would soon be the completed Confederation Bridge.

On land, construction happened tirelessly around the clock, 7 days a week, throughout all 4 seasons.







to Completion



November 19, 1996

11:30pm on a Tuesday night, the Svanen placed the last main bridge component; a drop in girder, between pier 34 and 35. This was a memorable event as the Confederation Bridge now spanned the Northumberland Strait entirely.



At approximately 5pm and after 4 years of round the clock construction, the Confederation Bridge opened to the public. The official Grand Opening was a nationally televised event and the beginning of something new!



Did You Know...

Everyone knows by now that the Confederation Bridge is 12.9 kms, or for our American neighbors, about 9 miles. Everyone also knows that maximum travelling speed across the Bridge is 80km/hr, but there's still some things you may not already know!

It took a team of over 6,000 people to build the Confederation Bridge? That's like hiring 4 people a day, for 4 years straight!

There is approximately 12,690km of post tensioning cable inside the Confederation Bridge? That's like driving from one end of the Island to the other 45 times! That's a LOT of cable!

The Confederation Bridge is the longest bridge over ice covered water in the world? Unfortunately, you likely won't see any penguins.

The Confederation Bridge was designed to last 100 years and perhaps even longer!



Confederation Bridge Announces Changes to Overnight Tolling

The Confederation Bridge is announcing changes in the toll plaza operations in order to meet changing consumer habits and redeploy its resources more effectively.

Effective starting Sunday, October 7, 2018 between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. each day and for the period from October to May each year, toll payment will be accepted as follows:

- Lane 1 Cash Only Payments
- Lanes 1 & 2 StraitPass (electronic toll payment)
- Lanes 3 & 4 Confederation Bridge gift cards, debit cards, credit cards (Visa, Master Card, Amex) including the convenience of Tap n'Go.
